- Members were introduced
- Purpose of SOT was reviewed following CCSD guidelines
- Member roles were nominated and voted on
- Last month data – August 2023 was reviewed and approved anonymously.
- NSPF reports for school year 22-23 were compared to school year 21-22.
 - Academic Achievement Indicator: math proficiency increased 9 points; ELA proficiency increased 2 point; science increased
 - WIDA increased one point
 - Teachers lacked the purpose of the test, and the teachers did not know the parts of the WIDA assessment.
 - Student error was reported because the students were pressing stop button during the middle of the recording. Training on how to teach the students how to take the WIDA will be reviewed with the teachers. Strategists will be assessing the students in small group.
 - Chronic absenteeism is at 35%; those are the students who were absent more than 18 days per year (more than 10%).
 - Median Growth Percentile Indicator indicates the percentage of students who are making growth and the school growth is the same in ELA and for Math it higher to the district median.
 - The AGP Target decreased impacting the Closing Opportunity Gaps Indicator
 - Solutions: Teachers are meeting 1:1 with the students, were teachers speak about the student's individual goals. This will serve as a motivation along with the ceremony for third, fourth, and fifth grade students.
 - This school year 23-24, notices will be sent to the parents to motivate the students and to make sure the students are present during testing days.
- Standard-Based Report Card and Grading will have a 1 to 4 point scale for the upcoming school year 2024-2025 after getting parent approval.
 - These points will be based specifically to the student's individual performance in the standards. Parents will be able to identify the strengths and weaknesses of their child(ren).
 - Growth will be able to be demonstrated as the students can be reassessed to give them an opportunity to demonstrate mastery.
 - Parents need to be aware that the students can request for their child(ren) to be reassessed as well.
 - Schools are required to give four week report cards.
 - Teachers will create the rubrics.
 - There will four parent meetings to provide information about SBRC and to receive feedback from parents. A survey will be available for parents on paper and on a QR code. There has to be total commitment from the school teachers as well.
 - At the moment the school has common grading practices.
